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Summary

Between the 27th and the 29th October 2008, OA East carried out an archaeological watching brief at The Green, Green Street, Willingham, Cambridgeshire (TL 4076 7044). The monitoring was carried out during improvement works to The Green.

The watching brief found a north to south tarmac road (this road had been recorded on all OS maps between 1885 and 1952). The road had been grassed over about 40 or so years ago. Natural gravel and sands were exposed below this road as well as a late 19th or 20th century ceramic pipe which had run under it. Existing 20th century services running east to west directly to the south of Church Street were uncovered. Only the top part of the present east to west road through The Green was removed in the development and machining stopped at a layer of hardcore.

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1 Geology and Topography

1.1 The site overlies first terrace sand and gravel deposits and Ampthill Clays (British Geological Survey Sheets 187 and 188, Huntingdon and Cambridge, 1981). The area lies at approximately 5.00m OD. Work during the watching brief exposed natural sub soil which consisted a bright yellow gravel sands with a few small patches of clay.

2 ARCHAEOLOGICAL BACKGROUND

- 2.1 The site is located at the eastern edge of the historic core of the village of Willingham. The green has been a focal point of the village for centuries and is surrounded by known archaeological sites while recent fieldwork further south along Green St revealed evidence of medieval occupation along the street frontage (HER MCB16302, ECB1835).
- 2.2 There was a north to south road recorded within the whole area of the watching brief on all the Ordnance Survey maps from 1885 to 1952 (e.g. Fig. 3). Directly to the west of the road there were buildings including a fire station. In modern day maps this road and the buildings directly to the west were not recorded and this area had became part of an expanded green area within The Green. The present east to west road was also recorded on the 1st Edition OS map (Fig. 3).
- 2.3 Improvement works were proposed at the Green by Willingham Parish Council. As a consequence Cambridgeshire County Council Archaeological Office issued a brief setting out the requirements for archaeological monitoring of the initial stages of construction, to include all ground works (Gore 2008). A specification by Oxford East for archaeological monitoring and recording was produced (Mortimer 2008).
- 2.4 Archaeological work was required to fulfil a condition placed on planning consent (S/0320/08/F) of South Cambridgeshire District Council. The proposed development included the removal of an area of hard standing which will subsequently be grassed over, and the excavation of a new access road.

3 Methodology

- 3.1 The objective of this watching brief was to determine as far as reasonably possible the presence/absence, location, nature, extent, date, quality, condition and significance of any surviving archaeological deposits within the development area.
- 3.2 The Brief required that soil stripping would take place under archaeological supervision. There would be an inspection of subsoil for archaeological features. These features were to be recorded in plan and investigated. Subsoil stripping would take place under archaeological supervision. Investigation would then take place of the natural substrate for archaeological features, their investigation and recording.
- 3.3 The area of investigation was located at The Green between Church Street and Green Street. The development proposed a new road within a north to south area c.50m long and c.5m wide starting from Church Street. The present ground surface in this area was to be taken down up to a depth of c.0.7m and then the new road hardcore and

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tarmac is to be laid. At the same time an existing east to west road (see 2.2 above) is to be removed. This road area was to be taken down to c.0.5m below ground level and the area then grassed over except where this existing road overlaps with the proposed new road. Most of the area of the proposed new road in the scheme (the northern part) is green within The Green area but in the lower southern part was the end of the old east to west road.

- 3.4 In the southern area of the proposed road a 360° tracked machine had to use a toothed bucket to remove the existing road surface on the 27th and 28th October. The tarmac and hardcore was removed from site but in the grassed area, a toothless ditching bucket was used on the 29th October.
- 3.5 All archaeological features and deposits were recorded using OA East's *pro-forma* sheets. Trench locations, plans and sections were recorded at appropriate scales digital photographs, black and white film and colour slides were used.

4 Results

Watching Brief

- 4.1 The watching brief did uncover a previous north to south tarmac road (this road had been recorded on all OS maps between 1885 and 1952 before it had been grassed over about 40 or so years ago). Natural gravel and sands were exposed below this road as well as a late 19th or 20th century ceramic pipe. Existing 20th century water services running east to west directly to the south of Church Street were uncovered. This 5m wide area included an existing man hole. This manhole led to a large modern brick vault more than 1.5m deep which the water pipes fed into.
- 4.2 The excavation for the removal of the present east to west road through The Green did not reach natural subsoils with only the underlying hardcore of this modern road exposed.

5 DISCUSSION AND CONCLUSIONS

Conclusions

No pre-modern archaeological remains were found. Modern activity has removed any possible archaeology within the watching brief area.




Figure 1 Location of the watching brief outlined (red)

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


Figure 2: Watching Brief area

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


Figure 3: 1st Edition Ordnance Survey map, 1885

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
