ABINGDON, Barton Court Farm

Alistair Whittle's analysis of the pottery from Neolithic features at Barton Court Farm showed the majority to be Grooved Ware. A preliminary radio carbon date of 4030+ 80bp has been obtained from one of these pits which was rich in botanical remains.

Mark Robinson reports that examination of the moss packed between the stones of the deep Roman well showed it to have been collected from a wood growing on limestone. Interesting finds from it included seeds of wild strawberry and oak leaf spangle galls.

ABINGDON, The Vinyeard

Examination of the burnt bone fragments with the R-B flagon suggests a cremation burial. This indicates that the nearby E-W inhumation is of Roman period also. Another fragment from the probable medieval drier or oven looks suspiciously like part of a human mandible (?residual, not cooked!). Does this mean the presence of an R-B cemetery?

BENSON

Maureen Mellor and Richard Chambers have identified more pottery from the fieldwalking in Benson parish organised by Gordon Miles. Pottery sherds from Neolithic, (identified by Mr H Case), Iron Age, Romano-ritish, Saxon, Saxon-Norman, Medieval and Post-medieval periods were maps of the parish. Yet again Gordon Miles and the Bensington Society have successfully demonstrated the type and quantity of information that can be obtained by fieldwalking.

BERINSFIELD, Mount Farm

Excavations are now proceeding on the southern part of the site where there is a complicated mass of features of early Iron Age to Roman date, and some earlier neolithic material. The latter has included finding a sherd of ?grooved ware pottery and a fine leaf shaped flint arrowhead associated with it. Another pre-Iron-Age but undated feature being excavated is a small oval "ring-ditch" surrounding a crouched burial which has been badly disturbed by later Roman ditches. One of these late ditches contained two extended inhumations, and also produced the first piece of recognizably late Roman (3rd/4th century) pottery. The plan of the area is still rather confused but in outline there again seems to have been occupation from the early Iron Age through to the

Roman Period with some earlier activity as well, and once again considerable continuity is evident in the layout of the site from the mass of rocut and parallel ditches dating at least from the middle Iron Age. A fair number of post holes have been found, but they do not clearly form any building plan; possibly some of them represent fences on the same line as the ditches.

BICESTER, Kings End Farm Housing Development

Building development continues on this site. Mr Biebrakh has recorded further Romano-British material a little to the east of the features recorded last year.

BUSCOT, Buscot Lock

The construction of a new weir around the lock revealed an old channel of the Thames. Mr Wilson, the lock-keeper notices a layer of peat in it and samples were taken by Ms Hilary Wade and Mark Robinson. It contains evidence of a post-glacial woodland flora.
