ABINGDON - Ashville Trading Estate

Michael Parrington is progressing well with the report on this site and hopes to complete this by July 1976.

ABINGDON - Barton Court Farm

David Miles has been supervising work on this site which should continue for the next six weeks. They have completed excavation of one new area which has so far revealed that the paddock was used for growing grain and burying babies! There is a possible building at the side of the trench which will be investigated further in the near future. There are post holes across the site which are? Iron Age or early Roman date. These form a definite curving arc and could possibly represent part of a corral.

Diane Collins has also been working on the site washing pot that has been found. Wendy Lee has been drawing the pot and has a few finds left to do.

Bob Wilson has been sieving through the top soil of 3-4 ditches and has come across a lot of pottery. A scattering of small fish bones has been found in the south boundary ditch.

ABINGDON - Stert Street

The Abingdon Area Archaeological and Historical Society is working on this site under the supervision of Michael Parrington. Members of the Society have found four superimposed buildings to dat - ? 12th century - and also a mid-Victorian well!

FARMOOR

Mark Robinson has finished examining the samples taken from this site - the most exciting discovery has been the presence of a ? Roman applecore! Early next month Mark hopes to be able to go to the Institute of Archaeology in London to examine the wood specimens in more detail.
