COINS AND JETONS, ST JOHN'S COLLEGE LIBRARY, OXFORD (OXJL 16) by Ian R Scott

There are 16 early Stuart farthing tokens and four jetons. Most of the coins and jetons come from contexts 209, 224 and 285 (Table 1).

Most of the farthing tokens date from the reign of Charles I and comprise three Richmond farthings (dated 1625-35) and ten Rose farthings (1636 and after). Rose farthings are by far the most commonly found of the farthing tokens of Charles 1. The other three farthings date to the reign of James I and comprise two Lennox farthings (c 1616-22/3), one possibly counterfeit, and a probable counterfeit Lennox farthing. The farthings types are those defined by Everson (2007)

The jetons comprise three 'Rose and orb' jetons of Hans Krauwinckel II (1586-1635) and an anonymous Nuremberg jeton dated c 1500-70.
