Summary

On the 26th January 2010, OA East carried out an archaeological watching brief at St James Green, Southwold, Suffolk (TM 650955 276230). The brief required the observation of a hand-excavated trench 14m long, 0.6m wide and 0.85m deep prior to the laying of a new water pipe. No archaeological features were observed. A small number of mostly post-medieval artefacts were recovered.

1 GEOLOGY AND TOPOGRAPHY

1.1.1 The underlying natural geology consists of sand and gravel. The site lies at c.12m OD which drops sharply down to the sea 70m to the east.

2 ARCHAEOLOGICAL BACKGROUND

- 2.1.1 Evidence for prehistoric activity in Southwold has been unearthed due to erosion, a large number of flint adzes and blades have been recovered from out of the cliff face.
- 2.1.2 The site lies within the area of medieval Southwold, defined in the County Historic Environment Record as an archaeological site of regional importance. Southwold is mentioned in the Domesday Book, in 1086. St Edmund Church (located c. 500m west of the site) was built in the late Medieval period.

3 Methodology

- 3.1.1 The objective of this watching brief was to determine as far as reasonably possible the presence/absence, location, nature, extent, date, quality, condition and significance of any surviving archaeological deposits within the development area.
- 3.1.2 The Brief required that the digging of an open-cut trench and the up-cast soil be observed during and after excavation.
- 3.1.3 Site conditions did not inhibit the observation of work, the weather was cold and sunny.

4 Results

4.1 Topsoil strip

- 4.1.1 The topsoil (1) was excavated to a depth of 0.7m. The soil was a dark brown silty sand with occasional small to medium sub-rounded stones and contained a moderate amount of bone and brick fragments. A small patch of mid brown-grey sand subsoil (2) with abundant small and medium sub-rounded stones was uncovered in a small section of the trench toward its northern end.
- 4.1.2 The hand-cut trench did not go deep enough to uncover any archaeology or natural geology.

4.2 Finds summary

4.2.1 All the finds came from the topsoil. The assemblage consists of two clay pipe stems dating to post-1580, two sherds of Raeren stoneware dating the late 15th to early 16th century, three sherds of 16th to 17th century pottery and two sherds of possible Roman grey sandy ware. Several brick and tile fragments were observed but not collected.

4.2.2 Twenty three fragments of animal bone were recovered, of which 9 were identifiable to species (39% of the total sample). All but two of these consist of butchered adult cattle remains, including portions of metacarpal, astragalus and scapula. A portion of butchered adult pig distal humerus and scapula were also recovered. The humerus was sawn at both ends and displayed 6 severe knife cuts at varying positions.

5 DISCUSSION AND CONCLUSIONS

5.1.1 No archaeological features were observed during the excavation. The finds recovered are of a quantity and type to be expected from within a town, consisting of post-medieval culinary and domestic debris.




Figure 1: Location of watching brief trench (black)
