The worked and burnt stone

A single stone artefact was recovered from ditch fill 2112. It is a quartzitic sandstone cobble that was broken in antiquity. The subsequently waterworn cobble was then used as a pestle, with one whole rounded end battered where it has been used as a hammerstone/pounder.

The pounder was one of a number of burnt quartzite and quartzitic sandstone cobbles, pebbles and stones observed on site. A sample of these (Table 1), were examined but none were found to be otherwise utilised.

Pestle/pounder. Quartzitic sandstone. Cobble, broken and waterworn subsequent to breakage. Then used as a pestle. Whole of one end is battered through use as a pounder/pestle. Burnt. Measures 68mm high x 54 x 48mm. Weighs 188g. Ctx 2112, fill of middle Iron Age ditch 2107.
